## Services Held For John E. Hoadley

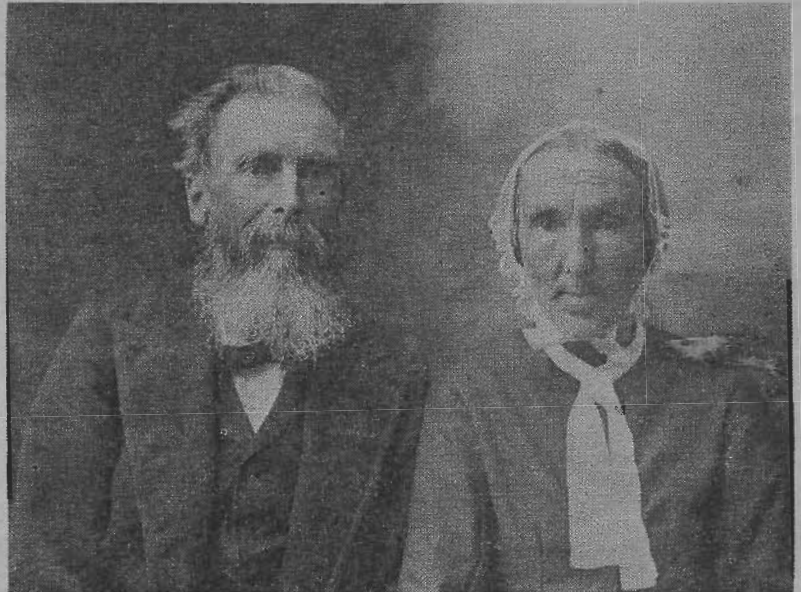
Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon at the Presbyterian church for John E. Hoadley.

## Standing Family 100th Anniversary



The Standing Reunion will be held August 21, 22 and 23 in commemoration of the arrival of the George Standing family who came from England one hundred years ago. The activities will be held in the Friends Meeting House north of Earlham and in the homes of Miriam Standing and Roy Knight, the site where George and Deborah lived and raised their family.

Around 150 descendants from twelve states, Arizona, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania and Iowa will be in attendance.

George Standing was born in Battersea, England, May 28, 1830. After attending boarding school he was apprenticed to a storekeeper in the Isle of Wight. Here he became an expert tea taster. Later he purchased a store which he operated with the assistance of an apprentice, until he began to make plans for emigration to America.

In 1855 George and Deborah Fox were married. Deborah was born in Dewsbury, England, August 23, 1832. Her family had been Quakers for generations. Her mother's great great grandfather, an intimate friend of William Penn, came with him to assist in the founding of Pennsylvania.

George and Deborah had six children born in England, a daughter Edith Rebecca who lived for one year and seven months and five sons — Henry, Ernest,

George, Charles and Alfred.

On February 8, 1870 the Standing family sailed for America on the Idaho which was propelled by both steam and sails.

George purchased land four miles north of Earlham where they settled. Their original house still stands north of Miriam Standings home and the cottage which they built on their farm for their retirement in 1897 still stands near the Roy Knight home but is in the process of deterioration.

After coming to this community the sixth son Josiah was born. He, the only living son, is approaching his 98th birthday. He makes his home with his son Ernest and his daughter-in-law Clarion who live near Beaumont, California.

The six sons, three of whom lived beyond 95 years, spent all or part of their lives in this vicinity and made contributions in various ways. Henry, the oldest, married Eunice Peacock of Earlham and after her death he married Gina Branson of West Branch. Alfred married Alice Crew of West Branch. Three of the brothers married three of the Nicholson sisters of Rochester, New York. George E. married Sarah, Charles married Alice and Josiah married Frances.

George and Deborah as long as they lived were much interested in their grandchildren. Death came to the grandmother Deborah in 1901 and to the grandfather George in 1912.

## Obituary

John Earnest Hoadley, son of Willard and Elizabeth Hoadley, was born in Madison County, Iowa, September 19, 1892 and passed away suddenly at his home in Earlham, August 7, 1970 at the age of 77 years, 10 months and 12 days.

He was united in marriage to Violet Schackle February 11, 1920. She passed away March 23, 1941.

He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Earlham, Iowa. He was a member of Masonic Lodge number 568 at Earlham, a veteran of World War I and a member of the American Legion Post 158.

On December 22, 1942 he was united in marriage with Mrs. Stella Taylor.

He lived his entire life in Madison County with the exception of spending some winters in Mesa, Arizona.

He was engaged in farming until he retired over 21 years ago.

His parents, one brother Vernon Clyde, two sisters Anna Gertrude Taylor and Effie May England, have preceded him in death.

He leaves to mourn his passing his devoted wife, Stella, Iliiff Hession, of Torrance, California who was raised in their home, five nieces and nephews, other relatives and many friends.
